

Preschool Supply List

- If your child is in the process of potty training one box of [pull ups with Velcro sides](#).
- A change of clothes, including socks, in a large Ziploc bag labeled with your child's name to be left at school.
- A book bag with your child's name on it (to send home artwork and school letters/information).
- A sippy cup or thermos type cup with a non-spill straw mouthpiece each day filled with water, milk, or juice (this will be sent back home each day) labeled with your child's name. As cups empty, we refill them with water. *No glass cups.*
- If not purchasing a catered lunch, you will need to send a lunch box labeled with your child's name and an ice pack (if needed) to keep the food fresh and cool. We have limited refrigerator space. *No glass containers.*
- *Special snacks if your child has food allergies or special dietary needs.*
- Plastic [2-pocket prong folder](#) labeled with your child's name.
- Three packages of baby wipes
- Three boxes of [100 count latex free gloves](#) (Your child's teacher must wear a fresh pair of gloves each time they change your child's pull up or assist them with using the restroom.)
- One container of [Clorox wipes](#) (or similar type product)
- One box of [Crayola Jumbo Crayons](#)
- One package of [9 X 12 Crayola construction paper](#)
- One bottle of hand soap (not hand sanitizer)
- Two bottles of [Elmer's school glue](#)

EVERYTHING should have your child's name on it. Your child's name on all personal items they bring to school is emphasized so that there is no confusion with personal items, coats, etc. **Please do not allow children to bring toys from home.**

We ask that tennis shoes or closed toed shoes be worn instead of sandals, flip flops, rain boots or crocs. This is a safety factor for falls and dropped toys. We will work with paints (washable) makers, outside play, etc. that requires appropriate clothing. Please keep this in mind when dressing your student for school.
